SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR A 24th May 2020

Dear Parishioners,

'Christ our model of prayer and suffering. Prayer is the birth right of every Christian. It is as natural to us as the air we breathe. The early Christians were people of deep prayer and suffered for their faith. Prayer and suffering are two sides of the same coin by which Christ gives glory to God in me.' (Pope Saint John Sunday Missal.)

On Wednesday 27th May, we celebrate our Patronal Feast, Saint Augustine of Canterbury. Let us ask his prayers for our Parish and School community and for our own individual needs. May his example help us to continue to grow in faith, hope and love. **On Friday 29th May,** we celebrate the Solemnity of the Dedication of our Church of Saint Augustine. May we soon be able to return to Church and to gather as God's family. **As you may have heard,** the Archbishops and Church representatives are in communication with Government officials as to when the churches will reopen and what procedures will need to be put in place. In preparation for the re-opening of the churches may I request volunteers for a rota for the daily cleaning of the Church. If you are able to help please contact the Presbytery. If you are able to clean the Church and to arrange the flowers would you need to be provided with protective equipment or would you be able to provide your own? Again, please let the Clergy know when you contact the Presbytery.

Father Dominic writes: 'Dear Parishioners, as I write this brief message it is the afternoon of Ascension Thursday. These days between Ascension and the Feast of Pentecost, May 31st, are days of extra significance. Let us join with our Blessed Lady as we await a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the one who renews our hearts and minds, pouring out His gifts on us and on our world. Jesus promised to send Him to us so that we would be His witnesses. May His presence continue to strengthen the bonds of family life and keep us ever close to the hearts of Jesus and Mary.'

Life becomes history

I would like to devote this year's Message to the theme of storytelling, because I believe that, so as not to lose our bearings, we need to make our own the truth contained in good stories. Stories that build up, not tear down; stories that help us rediscover our roots and the strength needed to move forward together. Amid the cacophony of voices and messages that surround us, we need a human story that can speak of ourselves and of the beauty all around us. A narrative that can regard our world and its happenings with a tender gaze. A narrative that can tell us that we are part of a living and interconnected tapestry. A narrative that can reveal the interweaving of the threads which connect us to one another.

**Lord, make us instruments of your peace,
Help us to recognise the evil
Latent in a communication that does
Not build communion.**

**Help us to remove the venom from our judgements.
Help us to speak about others As our brothers and sisters.**

**You are faithful and trustworthy;
May our words be seed of goodness for the world.**

**Where there is confusion, let us inspire harmony;
