Please pray for Deacon kevin who is unwell at this time. Wednesday 17th February, Ash Wednesday, marks the beginning of Lent and is a day of Fasting and Abstinence. The season of Lent is a period of grace and renewal and providentially coincides with springtime. As nature comes to life after winter, so the Church calls us to springtime in our hearts. May her intercession bring us comfort, healing and hope. We are making a slight adjustment to the manner in which we distribute Holy Communion, so as to minimise the movement in Church and so minimise possible virus carrying air currents. Holy Communion will now be distributed at the end of Mass. So, we ask that as you enter Church through the side porch, you would kindly place your Sunday Offering in the baskets provided and gel your hands. Having received Holy Communion please leave Church immediately, collecting a Newsletter and using the hand gel as you do so. Ready, steady, census The decennial census is almost upon us.

Households across Solihull will soon be asked to take part in the nationwide survey of housing and the population. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941.

Information from the digital-first census will help decide how services are planned and funded in your local area. This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, housing or new bus routes.

Households will receive a letter with a unique access code in the post, allowing them to complete their questionnaire online. Paper questionnaires will be available on request. Census day is March 21.
