May they discover the support and recovery that they need in order to live a full and happy life.

(Pause) Lord hear us. Response Lord graciously hear us.

READER: Let us pray for ourselves and all those whom we know and love as we start our Advent journey towards Christmas. May we follow the Star of Bethlehem and allow Jesus to be born in our hearts. (Pause) Lord hear us. Response: Lord graciously hear us.

READER: We give thanks that places of worship are now open for people to join in religious services and feel part of their Church community again.

(Pause) Lord hear us. Response: Lord graciously hear us

READER: We remember all who are sick, those in hospital and those who are housebound. We remember especially the sick of our own Parish; Father Fred Sheldon. Damian Poole, Kath Clark, Angela and Tony Duffy, James Farmer, Philomena Gallagher, Ken and Doreen Shirley, Chris Jena, Keith Frettsome, Lena Gallagher, Colette Hickey, Danny Meadows, Martha Sheridan, John Kavanagh, Patricia Mann and Paul Mann, Malachy Hanly, Dan Doyle, Adrian and Diane Burgess and our families wherever they may be.
