I know that we will pray for all whose lives have been affected and will try to respond in practical ways also. The Renewal Centre on Lode Lane are acting as a drop off centre for items that will benefit Afghan families who may come to settle in the Solihull Borough- such items include baby wipes, Nappies- all ages, New underwear- male, female and children, Adults clothes- new or nearly new (including coats) and Toiletries. CAFOD are working in Haiti to bring relief to the suffering and our mini autumn Fayre will provide an opportunity for us to express our solidarity..
